Lent: February—March



Trustee Report on Building Happenings


The Gaines Hall Policy has been completed and is on next page in full. As part of the completion, the following items have also been accomplished:

- ⇒ New chairs have come in and have been put in the Gathering Room (formerly the Parlor) and it the Community Room (formerly known as the Chapel). The chairs that were in both of those rooms were taken down to Gaines Hall for use.
- \Rightarrow Trash and donations that were housed in Gaines Hall for several months have now been taken away.
- \Rightarrow The lift will no longer be used to transport people. It will be used only as a Service Lift.
 - The one exception to this is that those in the congregation that have access to the church but cannot navigate steps from the street level to the main Sanctuary level.
- \Rightarrow Our CF & A affirmed the renaming of the Parlor and the Chapel Rooms.
- ⇒ Our Gathering and Community Rooms have been painted, set up, and new blinds adorn the windows.
- \Rightarrow The Community Cross has been rehung in the Community Room.
- \Rightarrow Reorganization of many rooms have taken place which allows for ministry areas to have space for storage.
- ⇒ New camera's have been installed in the back of the church and we replaced our controller for our alarm system.









Board of Trustees Gaines Hall Policy

Gaines Hall Use Policy Adopted by CF&A October 18, 2023

Purpose Statement: The purpose of establishing a clear policy for the use of Gaines Hall is to provide for the care and safety of our church family as well as any who come into our building. These policy statements were carefully and prayerfully considered, with the Task Force's full mind, heart and soul. Current situations continue to develop, and when there is a major change, this policy will be reconsidered. If there are any concerns with the policy as it stands, please direct questions to the Chair of CF&A or the Chair of Trustees.

1. The lift will no longer be considered accessible for use to transport people. It will be utilized as a "service lift" only, to transport cargo. Rules will be posted by each lift door and a current copy will be filed with the Office Manager.

2. Group sizes in Gaines Hall shall be limited to 65, exclusive of kitchen staff. The leader(s) of each gathering shall be responsible for compliance with this policy in terms of numbers and use. This policy will be provided to each leader by the Office Manager. The policy will be signed as read and understood by the leader, and a copy will be made to keep for church records along with a copy of the facility use application form filled out by that leader. IT IS FOR EVERYONE'S SAFETY THAT THIS OCCU-PANCY LIMIT IS NOT TO BE EXCEEDED.

3. No receptions will be held in Gaines Hall, as the number of potential occupants cannot be predicted or controlled. All receptions at the church will be held on the main floor.

4. Trustees shall ensure that all available cooking equipment in the Gaines Hall Kitchen is up to current safety standards and is fully operational.

5. A contact person will be appointed by Trustees to turn on gas for users of the pizza oven, and that person's contact information will be clearly posted in the kitchen, and by the pizza oven for any potential questions. A copy of that posting will be given to the Office Manager. The commercial range will be locked and unavailable for use, except in the presence of the appointed contact person.

6. This policy is subject to change with the approval of the Trustees.

Signature of group leader & date signed are required.

Once a person decides to be a facilitator of a class/study:



"Jesus: The God Who Knows Your Name" by Max Lucado

Matthew Aleksa will be facilitating a book study that will take place after Easter Sunday called "Jesus: The God Who Knows Your Name" by Max Lucado. This class will meet every Sunday from 11:15 am until 12:15 pm, after 10 am worship, in the Community Room. The class will consist of 6 sessions, beginning Sunday, April 7th and ending Sunday, May 12th. The cost for the book and study guide is \$17. Below is a description of the study:

You believe Jesus is God, but do you also think of Him as a real person? For thirty-three years, Jesus felt everything that we have ever felt: weakness, weariness, rejections, etc. To think of Jesus in such terms almost seems irreverent. There is something about keeping Jesus divine that keeps Him distant, packaged, and predictable. But we must remember that the people who saw Jesus first...saw Him first as a person. This six-session study "Jesus" inspires us to spend time at the foot of the cross and search the heart of the one who would rather die for us than live without us.


Come and Ring those Bells

GOOD NEWS! We have more books available to read!


Our United Women in Faith (UWF) Reading Program has benefitted by two positive developments: 1) the number of books selected for 2024 has noticeably increased, and 2) the number of books purchased for our church Library has increased, thanks to its \$200 UWF budget allotment, a \$20 reading award from the district reading program, and the generosity of some of our members.

Have you never heard of the UWF Reading Program? It is one of the interest groups within UWF. Any woman can join this group. Its purpose is to encourage our women to: expand one's understanding and participation in God's mission; increase sensitivity to all human beings; encourage critical thinking about today's issues; grow in understanding of Scripture as it relates to life today; enhance self-knowledge and act on it; and strengthen involvement in local and global Christian mission.

How to participate: Pick up a Guidelines sheet from our Library and consider the four plans available to follow. (The only difference among the plans is the number of books read.) Proceed to the north shelves where the UWF books are located according to five categories --Education for Mission, Spiritual Growth, Social Action, Nurturing for Community, and Leadership Development. Find a book, check it out by signing your name to the card and filing it in the recipe box right there, and enjoy learning something new. Return the book when finished, and repeat. Then, don't forget to fill out your booklist and turn it in when requested in early summer.

For over 150 years, members of UWF and its predecessor organizations have been involved in mission that includes prayer, study, and action. This Reading Program is a study opportunity that can lead to action and advocacy. Thus, it is another way to put your faith to work. We hope you will join us in this activity. *
