Greetings, Friends, in the Name and Spirit of the One whose Majesty fills the skies!

This Advent and Christmas Season, our worship series will emphasize the majesty of Christ. And why not? I don't know of anything more majestic than the truth we embrace this time of year that the very God who spoke the cosmos into existence with but a word, took on the form of a helpless, word*less* infant who would grow up to be the living Word of God!

And the story we tell of this One's birth is full of the earthly trappings of majesty: Roman Imperialism, Jerusalem Royalty, and Angelic Heralds. But it is also full of "earthy stuff": the sounds and smells of cattle, urban hustle and bustle, animal feeding and watering troughs, smoky fires, and unbathed shepherds. Hardly things we'd associate with majesty, much less His Majesty.

Of the witnesses we'll encounter this year in worship, only two are "repeat characters": one of the Magi and Joseph, Jesus' earthly father. The others would surely have been on the scene, but they were in the shadows and did not merit the attention of Matthew and Luke, the Gospel writers who gave us the birth narratives of Jesus. These characters are (1) the mother of Mary, (2) a wife of one of the shepherds, and (3) the son of the Innkeeper. Precisely because they're *not* Biblical characters, we can relate a little more naturally to them. We could have easily been one of

them, obscured by the shimmer and the sheen of the more dramatic characters drawing the spotlight in the story. But these others were still invited to witness the majesty of the Babe in the manger – and then to bear witness to what they'd seen. In fact, their witness may be more moving for us because it is not encrusted with familiarity and time.

We are each invited to take time this season to ponder the majesty of the singular event of the birth of Jesus, the Son of God, and then to consider how it is that we might describe the majesty we'd witnessed.

Come! Join us – either in person or through live stream – and be a part of the beautiful and transforming story of the One, who being in very nature God, did not see that as something to grasp and exploit, but who emptied Himself and took on the form of a servant, being born in human likeness, one like you and me. (Phil 2:6-7)

(No 9 PM service this year because of the extra worship the morning of Christmas Eve)


New Year's Eve Day, Sunday, Dec. 31st, 10 AM – This will

January—February 2024



We'll begin January (January 7th) with an emphasis on Epiphany, considering what Joseph's epiphany may have looked like, given that Mary and Jesus had quite the spectacular one with the visit of the Magi and the gifts they brought.

Our worship series in the latter half of January and the first half of February will be based on the book by Adam Hamilton *Half Truths: God Helps Those Who Help Themselves and*

Other Things the Bible Doesn't Say. After the drama of the Advent and Christmas Seasons, it will be a casual few weeks in worship as we take a breather before heading into Lent on Ash Weds. – Valentine's Day this year! – Feb. 14th.

Lent: February—March



Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, Valentine's Day! We'll have the customary drive-by distribution of ashes out in front of the

Church but also an evening service, emphasizing the wonderful connection between love that is too often onedimensional on Valentine's Day and the all-encompassing, self-giving love of God that conquers all.

The first Sunday of Lent is February 18th, and our Lenten theme will be *What R U Up 2?* Lent is often known as a time of giving something up in order to make room in our lives for spiritual pursuits. Rather than just "giving up" in Lent, this season, the scriptures ask us to consider all that Jesus is "up to" and all that he asks us to be up to in his name. What pursuits are we up to in our lives that call us to be our best selves, and our best selves as the church?

Coming In January Exploring United Methodism and Adult Confirmation

January—February 2024


Oftentimes, Confirmation is focused on middle school and younger high school students, but this year, we have had a lot of interest expressed in confirmation by more mature high school students, young adults, and other members of the Church.

At the same time, many in the Church, especially our newer members who may not have been exposed in much detail to the distinctives of the United Methodist Church, have expressed a desire to know more about our denomination and our heritage, particularly in light of the recent breaking away of the so-called Global Methodist Church from the UMC. What makes for the "them and us" differences between these two bodies of faith?

In order to be responsive to these expressed interests, Pastor Steve will be offering a 6-week class on United Methodism beginning January 14th and finishing up on the first Sunday in Lent, February 18th. It will culminate in an invitation to participate in Confirmation in worship for all those who desire to recommit their lives to Christ and FUMC as a result of this journey. Taking part in the class neither presumes nor requires confirmation on the part of the participants; it will just be a natural part of the study for those who are interested in adult confirmation.

Mature high school students, young adults, and the whole range of the adult demographic of our Church are welcome to be a part of this.

In order to maximize the opportunity for folks, we will be holding this class from 12 Noon to 1:30 PM on Sunday afternoons January 14, 21, and 28 and February 4, 11, and 18. You can go to Fellowship after worship and get a snack to tide you over, and then be home for a late lunch – and in time for football or handbells (If either of them is your thing)
