The trendy WWJD bracelet created in 1989 spawned countless variations on the theme, finding itself on T-shirts, license plates, bumper stickers, logos, coffee mugs, and a zillion other products.

It got us all to thinking about our faith not in terms of doctrines or beliefs but in terms of ethics: How should I *live* as a follower of Jesus? As opposed to "What should I believe?"

In worship today, we explore this using several examples from Jesus' life in the Gospels, basing our reflections on a beautiful passage in Scripture called the "kenosis" or "emptying" passage. It is so called because in it, Jesus, who being in very nature God, didn't see that as a privilege to

hang onto <u>at all costs</u> but as an empowering identity that allowed Him to empty Himself of it and become obedient to the will of the Father at all costs so that we might see what the love of God is all about.
